TOOTH AND BONE LOSS

What happens after tooth loss? Your teeth stimulate your jaw and keep jaw bones healthy and strong. When you lose teeth, you lose this stimulation and this causes bone loss to begin. This is called **RESORPTION**.

PROS AND CONS -Overdentures vs dentures

"Regular" Dentures sit in the mouth, held in place by a sticky adhesive. They are less expensive, but come with their own **DISADVANTAGES**. Dentures can:



Overdentures allow you to turn back the clock on your **SMILE**, and **EAT** and **LIVE** with **CONFIDENCE**. They also help to preserve your jawbone health so your bone doesn't disappear.

DENTURES

ADVANTAGES "Regular" Dentures sit in the mouth, held in place by a sticky adhesive. They are less expensive but come with their own issues.

DISADVANTAGES. This quick fix provides no bone stimulation and comes with difficulty eating, messy adhesives and discomfort.



ROOT-RETAINED OVERDENTURES

ADVANTAGES A great option if you have healthy tooth roots, are worried about cost, or are unwilling to choose implant-retained overdentures. Your tooth roots are used to retain a special attachment that supports a removable overdenture.

- Usually done in one short visit
- Less surgery required
- Portions of treatment often covered by insurance

DISADVANTAGES. Root-retained overdentures are also a temporary option until the patient gets an implant-retained overdenture. There is also a greater chance of decay around the posts.

IMPLANT-RETAINED **REMOVABLE** OVERDENTURES

ADVANTAGES This option can be removed by you for cleaning, but snap back into place for confident smiling, eating, and living

DISADVANTAGES. As the name implies, implant-retained removable overdentures can still be removed by the patient, making them less secure than fixed overdentures.



PROS AND CONS FOR **ROOT** AND **REMOVABLE**



PROS

Eat, smile and live with greater confidence. **ROOT** and implantretained **REMOVABLE** overdentures provide greater stability and a more natural look and feel. They help to preserve oral and bone health.



CONS

These options cost more than a regular denture, but the benefits can outweigh the costs. The **ROOT** option can be less expensive than the **IMPLANT-RETAINED** option since insurance will at times cover the cost of the treatment.
